Joe Lamy of Franklin, New Hampshire, was involved in the Babe Ruth program for over 35 years.

Joe's life was marked by a commitment to youth recreation, especially baseball. He started in the Babe Ruth program at the local league level serving as a manager, League President, Secretary and Treasurer.

After leaving the local league level, Joe held the positions of District Commissioner, Assistant State Commissioner, State Commissioner and Assistant Regional Commissioner until being elected New England Regional Commissioner in 1996. As a Regional Commissioner, Joe became an automatic member of the Babe Ruth League International Board of Directors.

Joe retired from the program in 2006. His distinguished career in the organization was capped by his induction into the Babe Ruth League International Hall of Fame in 2007.

Joe had a fondness for cigars and fishing, distaste for life's inefficiencies, and an abiding joy for the wonders of the Christmas season. He was a faithful spectator at his grandchildren's sporting events.
