Bob Curran was involved with the Babe Ruth program for 50 years. He started in 1956 as one of the founding fathers of the South Boston Babe Ruth League.

After serving several years as the local league level, Bob went on to become a very influential leader at the state level, holding such titles as District Director, State Director and Regional Commissioner. In 1970, Bob was elected to the Babe Ruth League Board of Directors, serving in various capacities over the span of 35 years, such as Chairman of the Board, Financial Chairman and Executive Consultant.

Bob shared a special friendship and business relationship with the late Ron Tellefsen, who served as Babe Ruth League President/CEO for over 25 years. It was because of their foresight and leadership abilities the program flourished financially, as well as experienced great growth in participants year after year.

Curran's business career spanned from 1951 to 2003 with Kemper National Insurance Companies. In honor of Bob's 50th anniversary with Kemper, the company donated \$50,000 to Babe Ruth League, Inc. (per Bob's instructions).

Bob, a United States Army Veteran, was inducted into the Babe Ruth League International Hall of Fame in 2007.
